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## 2019 FAIR DEDICATION

### GLEN KERR 1941 -2019

Glen was born in Saskatchewan in 1941 and moved to the Bulkley Valley with his family in 1949. After moving around a few times, Glen and his wife Dolores settled in Quick in 1974.

He started horse logging in 1983 and continued to do so for a number of years until no more timber sales were available for horse loggers. Glen started competing at the BV Exhibition in 1987, as well as at numerous other fairs. Many will remember him competing at the BC Championship Draft Horse Pull with his team of Belgians "Guy + Sabre" and in later years with various teams of Shires which he started breeding in 2000. Guy and Sabre also pulled the BVX Parade Wagon for a few years until they were retired and replaced by Glen's favorite team of Shires, "Jay + Trace".

Glen was also a director of the BVX for many years and in 2006 helped to form a Draft Horse Committee to keep the division going. He stayed on as division coordinator after he resigned as a director, and still actively participated in the fair until he passed away.

In 2006 he came up with the idea that we needed a Spring Horse Pull here in the Bulkley Valley and with help from Dolores Kerr, Anika Gattiker and many other volunteers as well as the support of the BVX, a successful Spring Heavy Horse Pull was organized for the last weekend of May and continued on for 12 consecutive years until 2017.

2006 was around the same time that Glen started doing commercial sleighrides out in Quick and continued to do so for at least 10 years. Many happy faces (and cold fingers and toes) were seen during the Christmas and New Year holidays and there were endless pots of coffee and hot chocolate served by Dolores at the open fire pit after a completed sleigh ride.

Glen loved the fair and spent countless hours conditioning his horses and preparing for fair time. Some years he brought up to seven draft horses to the BVX. He never got tired of showing his Belgians, Percherons and Shires to anybody interested in seeing them and was always to be found somewhere by the Draft Horse barn, visiting with old and new friends and exchanging horse stories.

He will be greatly missed but fondly remembered as one of the old teamsters of the Bulkley Valley.

- 4) Wheel axles must be incorporated into the zucchini itself. It's not acceptable just to attach a zucchini to an existing 'vehicle' that rolls. This means no attaching a zucchini to a skateboard, roller skate, toy car, etc.
- 5) Each racer must be self-propelled. No motors or auxiliary propulsion.
- 6) Please create a zucchini racer sturdy enough to compete in multiple races.
- 7) Wheels and axles may be All-Organic or Recycled. "All-Organic" means home-built using wood, vegetable pieces or plastic but not metal. "Recycled" wheels may be reused from an old toy car or skateboard as long as they abide by General Rules.

## HALL DIVISION RULES

1. An Exhibitor's Pass may be purchased with a minimum of 5 entries in Divisions B, E, F, G, J, K, L & T.
2. Note: New Hall entry form deadline is August 10, 2019. Exception: Division E (Vegetables & Flowers) – Saturday, August 17, 2019. Entry forms may be dropped off at the office or at the BV Fair Booth at the Farmer's Market. Payment must accompany entry form.
3. All exhibits in Divisions E, F, G, J, K, L & T must have been completed, or grown by the exhibitor in the past 12 months, unless article has not previously been entered for competition at this fair.
4. Only one entry in each class (Divisions E, F, G, J, K, L & T) by each exhibitor will be allowed.
5. If only one (1) entry in a class, no 1<sup>st</sup> place will be awarded unless the item is deemed of exceptional quality.
6. Judges decisions will be final.
7. Basis for awarding most points (Divisions E, F, G, J, K, L & T): three points for first, two points for second and one point for third, where applicable. Director's decision will be final.
8. Exhibits for Divisions B, E, F, G, J, K, T1, T2, T3, T7, T9 (except quilts) and V will be accepted between 10 am and 4 pm, Wednesday, August 21<sup>st</sup>. Exhibits will not be accepted after 4 pm.
9. Exhibits for Divisions L (Arts, Photography) and Quilts T4, T5, T6, T9 (classes 10-11) will be accepted ONLY at the following times: **August 16<sup>th</sup>** between 5 pm and 9 pm and **August 17<sup>th</sup>** between 10 am and 2 pm—**NO EXCEPTIONS**. This will aid in a more efficient display of exhibits; to allow for proper hanging.
10. No exhibits will be released unless exhibitor number is presented. The number of exhibitors allowed in the hall at one time may be restricted by the Association to ensure safe removal of exhibits.
11. The office will be open Monday to Thursday following the fair from 10 am to 4 pm. Exhibits must be picked up by the Tuesday of the week following the fair.
12. Cash payouts will be made for winnings under \$10. If not picked up, all other prize money will be mailed within 45 days of the final day of the fair.
13. A "FOR SALE" sign (2"x3") may be left with the Hall Committee to be attached to articles AFTER judging has been completed.
14. Hall Tags for entries will be available for pickup on August 16<sup>th</sup> at the BVX office during the day and at the Hall during the drop-off times listed above.

# DIVISION E: VEGETABLES, FRUITS, FLOWERS & GRAINS

## E1: Vegetables

**Entry Fee:** \$1

**Exhibitors' Guidelines:** Variety name should be stated on exhibitors tag. This adds to the educational value of the fair. All vegetables and fruits should be free from pests, blemishes and mechanical injuries. Entries should be clean but not scrubbed to the point of damaging the surface. **Potatoes and Onions should not be washed at all.** Arrange on paper or plastic plate.

**Beets:** Trim tops to 1/2 inch, leave roots intact; free of scab, scaling and sunburn.

**Cabbages:** The stalk should be trimmed but one or two of the outer leaves left on. A round, firm head is preferred.

**Carrots:** Tops should be trimmed to about 1/2 inch, fine bottom root may be trimmed but not cut off completely, no side roots. The surface should be smooth.

**Kohlrabi:** Roots and leaf stems should be trimmed close to the bulb.

**Herbs:** Even colouring, the herbs should be tied in neat bunches with clearly printed labels firmly attached.

**Lettuce:** All types of lettuce should be clean, tender, of even colour. Roots and only damaged outside leaves should be removed.

**Onions:** Roots trimmed to 1/2 inch, and tops should be mature, dried and trimmed to 1/2 inch. Only the dirty outer scales should be removed. Do not wash. Round shape is preferred.

**Potatoes:** No greening or scabs, eyes few and shallow, skin set, indicative of maturity, solid even coloured flesh, no inside growth cracks. Do not wash.

**Rhubarb:** All stalks at least 10 inches long, firm, and crisp. Pull stalks, cutting away loose, flaky tissue only. Trim leaf to 1 inch fan shape.

**Squash:** Trim stem to 1/2 inch, colour and shape appropriate to type, mature but not oversized.

**Tomatoes:** Should be firm, thick fleshed, stems should be left on, no green shoulders on red tomatoes.

**Please NOTE – Exhibitor must be amateur and not have grown produce for retail.**

## TERMINOLOGY:

**Annual:** a plant that grows, blooms, seeds and dies in one year and is reproduced from seeds

**Arrangement:** a flower arrangement is the art of using the principles of design to control one or more units of plant material to obtain beauty and harmony

**Biennials:** a plant that grown the first year and blooms, seeds and dies the second year and is reproduced from seeds

**Bloom:** a single flower on a stem, foliage removed

**Bouquet:** cut flowers in a clear container

**Collection:** a group of cut flowers (not judged on arrangement)

**Composition:** the art of using the principles of design, utilizing plant material with suitable accessories, to be displayed in one container

**Double & Semi-doubles:** flower has more than one layer of petals

**Kind:** shall be used to indicate plant characteristics which are similar and that belong to the same general category; e.g., asters and petunias are kinds of flowers

**Perennials:** a plant that lives for more than two years, growing from the same root, bulb or tuber each year, wintering either in or out of the ground

**Side shoots:** a lateral branch, with subsequent branching, but with the main stem excluded

**Single:** flower has a centre with one layer of petals

**Spike:** a flower structure with flowers stemless on a common lengthened stalk. Used sometimes where stems of the individual flowers are very short; e.g., gladiolus, snapdragons

**Spray:** a branch, bearing dependent branchlets or flowers

**Variety:** plants within the kind that differ from one another in one or more special characteristics

## JUDGING STANDARDS:

**Form:** Uniformity, proper shape and proper petalage

**Stem & Foliage:** Strength and or straightness, quality, size and proportion

**Colour:** Uniformity, intensity, clarity and brilliance

**Size:** Uniformity and proper size for variety

**Condition:** Must be free of blemish, pests, disease and damage

**RULES: Exhibitor must be an amateur and not have grown flowers for retail**

1. Please attach entry tags onto containers with ribbon, yarn or an elastic band before bringing to the Exhibit Hall – no tape accepted.

2. All flowers must be grown by the Exhibitor. House plants must be the property of the Exhibitor for at least six months prior to the fair.

3. All cut flowers should be displayed in clear glass containers provided by exhibitor.

4. Uniformity is very important. Select same-sized blooms.

5. Cut stems to same length, not necessarily long.

6. Foliage, spent flowers and seed pods should be removed.

7. Please label your entries with the variety name (for educational purposes at the Fair).
8. Plants and cut flowers should be free of disease, insects and blemishes or they will be removed.
9. Arrangements should be in a container of your choice.
10. Judged under Provincial Government Standards rules of perfection.

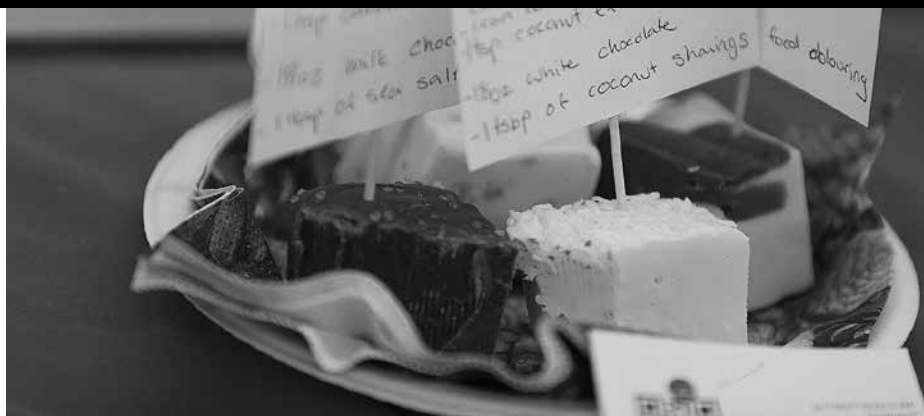
