- 21 Lavatera, 3 sprays
- 22 Lily, Asiatic, 1 spike
- 23 Lily, Oriental, 1 spike
- 24 Marigold, 3" or over, 6 blooms
- 25 Marigold, dwarf, under 3", 6 blooms
- 26 Nasturtium, single, 6 blooms
- 27 Nasturtium, semi double or double, 6 blooms
- 28 Sunflowers, 3 blooms
- 29 Nicotiana, 6 sprays
- 30 Pansy, giant, not less than 2" diameter, 6 blooms
- 31 Pansy (incl. violas) under 2" diameter, 6 blooms
- 32 Petunia, single, complete with buds and blooms, 3 sprays
- 33 Petunia, double, complete with buds and blooms, 3 sprays

- 34 Phlox, annual, 6 sprays
 - 35 Phlox, perennials, 3 sprays
 - 36 Rose, hybrid tea with foliage, 1 bloom
 - 37 Rose, rugosa, 3 sprays, foliage on
 - 38 Rose, Floribunda, 1 spray, foliage on
 - 39 Rudebeckia, 3 blooms
 - 40 Scabiosa, 3 spikes
 - 41 Sweet Peas, 6 spikes
 - 42 Sweet William, 3 spray
 - 43 Zinnia, large, 3 blooms
 - 44 Zinnia, dwarf, 6 blooms
 - 45 Collection of cultivated flowers, 3 of each kind (no limit on varieties, annual, perennial, varieties named) 1st prize \$10
 - 46 Cultivated flowers not listed elsewhere, 3 stems, 1 variety only, name variety
 - 47 Everlasting flowers, names, 3 varieties, 2 of each, name variety
- Most Points (01–47), 1st Prize, \$50**

E4: Floral Arrangements

Flowers do not need to be grown by the exhibitor and will be judged on arrangement. Amateurs only!

- 01 Grasses arrangement, 12–20" overall
 - 02 Flower Arrangement, overall height 8"
 - 03 Green with Envy – Greens only, maximum 18"
 - 04 Teacup and saucer arrangement
 - 05 Miniature floral arrangement, 2" and under overall
 - 06 Arrangement using dried flowers: materials, driftwood, accessories permitted
 - 07 Arrangement in a kitchen utensil item
 - 08 MEN ONLY – Own choice of arrangement and container under 16"
 - 09 Bouquet: **Fair Theme "Dazzlingly Gorgeous! - Fabulously Brilliant. It's Mardi Gras Time"** \$50 cash.
 - 10 CHILDREN ONLY Use Wild, Home Grown or Bought flowers
- Most Points (01–10): \$25 Cash**

E5: Plants

Pots not to exceed 12".

- 01 African violet, single
- 02 African violet, double

- 03 African violet, frilled
 - 04 Begonia Rex
 - 05 Cactus
 - 06 Foliage House Plant – not a fern
 - 07 Unusual plant noted for its rarity or oddity
 - 08 Orchid
 - 09 Succulent (Jade, Bilbergia, etc.)
 - 10 Plant not listed elsewhere, named
 - 11 Collection of house plants in one pot
 - 12 Fern, not hanging
 - 13 Cactus, grown in container for three months
 - 14 Terrarium
 - 15 Outdoor patio planter, not hanging, 14" pot size
 - 16 Outdoor Tuberous Begonia, 14" pot size
 - 17 Woodland Garden in 14" pot, 1st \$20 cash, **Glenwood WI**
 - 18 Fairy Garden, in a wooden box 12" x 15" x 4" deep, \$25 gift certificate
- Most Points (01–18) \$25 cash**

E6: Grains & Forage

Entry fee: \$2

Entry deadline: August 20th, 2022

Prize money: 1st \$15, 2nd \$10, 3rd \$5

Entry form: Use General Entry Form

Must be grown on exhibitor's farm in 2022.

- 01 Sheaf barley, variety named
 - 02 Sheaf oats, early, variety named
 - 03 Sheaf oats, late, variety named
 - 04 Sheaf spring wheat, variety named
 - 05 Sheaf fall wheat, variety named
- Note:** Sheaves should be arranged in compact form and must be 3^{1/2}" in diameter just below the heads. Cereal grains must be stripped of leaves and roots, also free of excess moisture to prevent mould. A tag designating the variety must accompany each sheaf.
- 06 **Baled Hay Contest**–2022 crop: Grass and mixed legume hay (no cereal hay), one square bale to be entered
 - 07 **Round Bale**–2022 crop: **core sample displayed in one litre Ziploc bag (must be full).** **Most Points (01–07), \$20 cash**
