GENERAL RULES: EXHIBITORS

1. Please Note: ONE ENTRY FORM PER EXHIBITOR with First and Last Name along with complete mailing address and phone number is required.
2. All entries must be made on prescribed forms located in this book or online at www.bvfair.ca
3. Entry fees must accompany all entry forms. Money for exhibitors' passes and camping fees must be included if required. No refund on entry fees and/or exhibitors' passes except as outlined in livestock and horse division rules. \$25 fee on NSF cheques.
4. Entry fees are shown above each Division or Class.
5. Entry forms deadline—see p.4 for each division.
6. Exhibitor passes may be purchased with minimum requirements—see specific divisions for more details.
7. Exhibitor camping rates are available for exhibitors who meet minimum criteria established by each division.
8. Exhibitors who are showing in more than one division will be limited to the maximum number of passes in one division only.
9. Any exhibitor, who violates any of the General Rules, or any of the rules printed herein, shall be liable to forfeit any or all prize money and awards made to such an exhibitor, and may also be barred from further competition for such a period as may be decided by the Directors.
10. Exhibitors of animals, machinery in motion, and other exhibits liable to cause accidents, injury or damage to property, or to a person coming into contact with them, shall guard their exhibits and protect the public from coming in contact there within, and every exhibitor shall indemnify the Association from and against all claims, demands, costs, charges and expenses which may occur, suffer, or be put to, by reason of accident, or any person properly guarded, or the public not being properly guarded there from.
11. Each exhibitor shall assume responsibility for any injury occasioned to himself, or his assistants, while exhibiting or performing.
12. The Association will take all responsible precaution to ensure the safety of exhibits sent to the exhibition, but the owners themselves must take the risk of exhibiting them, and should any exhibit, or portion thereof, be injured, lost or stolen, the Association will give assistance to the recovery of same, but will not be liable, or make payment for the value thereof. Night watchmen will be employed by the Association during the exhibition.
13. All Perpetual Trophies must be returned to the office 30 days prior to the start of the Exhibition.
14. Judges' decisions will be final.
15. All protests or appeals must be made in writing, must state plainly the cause of the complaint, and must be delivered to the BVX General

Manager within 48 hours of the closing of the fair, accompanied by a certified cheque for \$100, refundable if the complaint is upheld by the Board of Directors.

16. In offering prizes set out in this prize list, the Directors of the Association wish it to be understood that, in the event of funds at the disposal of the Association not being adequate to cover prize money in full, a pro rata reduction will be made. Special prizes offered by outside parties will be paid to the winners if received by the Association.
17. No reissuing of prize money cheques will be undertaken. All cheques and certificates must be cashed or redeemed by December 31 of the current year.
18. Exhibit removal: After 5 pm Sunday. If exhibits are removed prior to 5 pm Sunday, prize money will be forfeited.
19. All prize money will be mailed within 45 days of the final day of the fair.
20. Sale of raffle tickets is restricted to rented booths only, and must meet with the approval of the Association. Organizations are responsible for their own lottery licenses and a copy must be submitted to the office one (1) week prior to the first day of the exhibition.
21. The Association reserves the right to refuse or terminate any exhibit or display it deems to be illegal, immoral, or not in keeping with the atmosphere of the exhibition, and to return any entry fee without being liable for compensation.

GENERAL RULES: GUESTS & EXHIBITORS

22. Admission to the grounds will be by ticket or pass only. No badge or ribbon will permit entry to the grounds.
23. All vehicle and/or camping passes issued must be hung in front windshield of vehicle or admission to the grounds will be refused. During the exhibition, vehicles not displaying passes will be towed away at the owners' expense. Vehicle passes are limited – see entry forms for details.
24. Camping fees will be charged for each camping site on the grounds. New for this year – reservations will be accepted online at www.bvfair.ca; remaining sites will be available on a "first come basis". Additionally, all campers must purchase a 4-day pass to the exhibition.

Camping wristbands must be worn at all times during the exhibition. All campers must complete a camping application form, available online at www.bvfair.ca and at BVX Fair Office.

25. Camping is family-friendly and alcohol may only be consumed in designated camp sites. Smoking or vaping of cannabis is prohibited in public places on the fairgrounds and may only be consumed in your designated camping area. The association reserves the right to evict camping guests or exhibitors who create a disturbance and/or nuisance to other campers or fairgoers.

26. Parking and camping are under the control of the grounds and camp managers. Guests and exhibitors must confine their vehicles and campsites to the designated areas. Violators may have their privileges revoked and/or vehicles towed at owner's expense. No vehicle movement on grounds after 10 am.
27. All dogs on the grounds must display a fair-issued permit. Further to this, Town of Smithers bylaws requires you to clean up after your dog and have your dog on-leash at all times. Any uncontrolled dogs will be removed. This policy adheres to the Town of Smithers dog leash bylaw and will be strictly enforced.

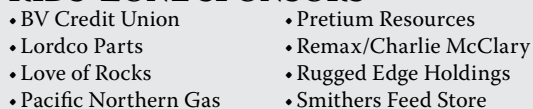
4-H SHOW AND SALE

Loggers' Sports will be focusing on local competitors this year – so you and the kids can sign up for choker races, axe throwing, nail drive and more!

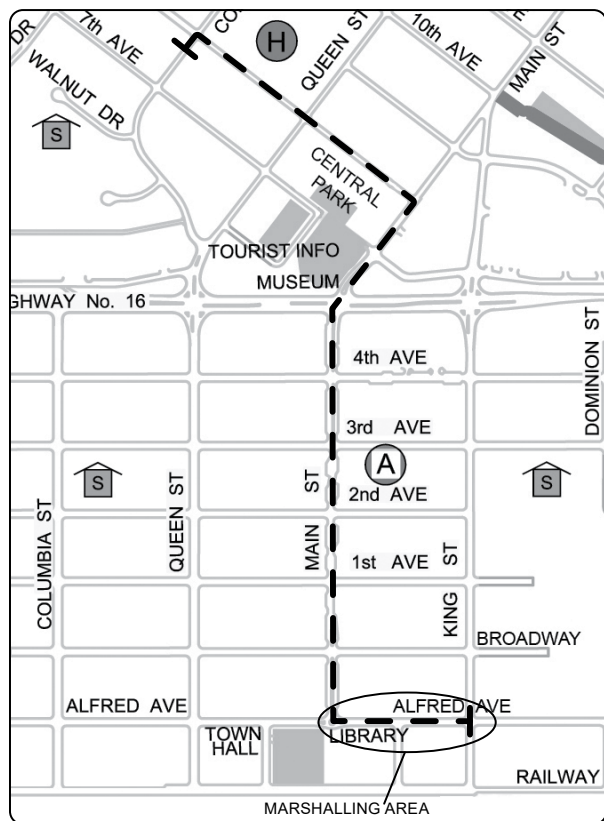
JJ's Woodart will be back by the Logger's Sport arena working his wonders with a chain saw!

The Mayor and Council welcome you to the 2023 Smithers Fall Fair and to our community. Whatever brings you to the Fair, whether it is the rides, the food, the displays or the animals, it is our hope that you enjoy yourself thoroughly.



DIVISION A: LIVESTOCK

GENERAL RULES:

- 1) Entries will close August 12th, 2023. **All entries to include full payment and photocopies of registrations.** No late entries will be accepted.
- 2) **Prize money amounts will be subject to entry levels and sponsorship.**
- 3) There will be no prize money awarded unless the exhibit is worthy or otherwise marketable.
- 4) Owners are responsible to feed and water their own stock. Shavings will be provided. **Note: Livestock owners are liable for damage or injury caused by their animals.**
- 5) Barn space will be allocated by the BV Exhibition.
- 6) All animals exhibited shall be free from contagious or infectious diseases. The Committee may have any animal inspected by a Veterinarian prior to unloading. The Committee may order the removal from the grounds or isolation of any animal considered by the Veterinarian to be contagious or infectious.
- 7) **Exhibits may not be removed from barns until after 5 pm on Sunday.** Out of town exhibitors may request early removal – 2:00pm on their entry form but no trailers or trucks in until after 5 pm. We can assist with equipment haul out to parking lot.
- 8) All exhibitors are encouraged to decorate their stalls. Include information about the entries and the exhibitor. Educating the public and potential customers is very important in the promotion of your product and contributes to the fair's goals and objectives. Decorations may not be removed until after 5 pm on Sunday.
- 9) All livestock exhibitors are required to clean their stalls and pens before leaving the grounds.
- 10) No refunds will be issued without a veterinarian certificate.
- 11) Livestock should not be on the grounds before Thursday, except by prior arrangement with division contact.
- 12) All livestock trailers and trucks must be parked outside of the gates.
- 13) Prize money will be mailed after the Fair.
- 14) Exhibitors must abide by all rules or prize money will be forfeited.
- 15) No animals allowed in the camping areas.

RULES

- 1) All cattle must be shown on a halter.
- 2) Bulls over one year of age cannot be shown without either a ring in the nose or use of a humbug. Bulls over one year of age must be handled by a mature handler.
- 3) All cattle must be tied with a safety rope in addition to a halter.
- 4) All animals must display CCIA RFID tags. Untagged animals will not be allowed on the premises.
- 5) All animals exhibited in the classes of registered livestock must be registered in the name of the exhibitor at closing date of entries. The animal's name, date of birth, and registration number must be given on the entry form. Current-year animals do not require registration certificates but must be eligible for registration and properly identified. All Angus entries MUST be registered at the time of judging and proof of registration provided. Photocopies of registrations must be sent with entry forms.
- 6) All animals exhibited must be weighed on Thursday at the prescribed times.
- 7) If more than 20 head in any class, the committee may split class and pay out prizes on each class.
- 8) All animals exhibited must be owned by the exhibitor or the exhibitor's family.
- 9) All exhibitors must have an exhibitor's pass.
- 10) 4-H members entering Open Classes must pay regular entry fees.
- 11) Exhibitor must wear exhibit number and animal information.
- 12) All clipping/grooming chutes are restricted to designated areas only.
- 13) Angus Show animals are NOT to have any colour products applied to them.
- 14) Animals may not be tied to the ring fencing (inside or outside) except for holding until the next class.

All entries to include full payment for: events, stabling, camping etc.** You may submit your entries online at bvfair.ca, or if you use the draft horse entry form, please note that correctly completed forms will be given priority. All entry forms must be signed in order to validate the entry. Unsigned forms will not be processed. Mail entries to **BV Exhibition, Draft Horse Division, Box 2281, Smithers, BC, V0J 2N0**. Post entries will be accepted up to 12 hours before show at double entry fee.
- 2) **BC Championship Pull limited to 18 entries by order of entries received. All teams entering the BC Championship Pull must enter at least two non-pulling classes (1 halter class/1 driving event or 2 driving events).**
- 3) Entry fee is 10% of first prize money. Pull: \$50 per team. Single Pull: \$25.
- 4) Every effort will be made to have the prize money mailed out within 30 days after the end of the exhibition.
- 5) **All horses must be stalled during fair hours.** Tie stalls \$10/weekend, Box stall \$15/weekend +GST. Box stalls will be reserved for stallions and mares with foals. Stalls will be allotted primarily in order of entries. \$20/tie stall, \$40/box stall will be deducted from prize money if stalls are left dirty.
- 6) Exhibitors must purchase an Exhibitor's Pass at \$15 per exhibitor. On-ground camping fee is \$30. All fees must accompany entry forms. NSF cheques: \$25 service charge.
- 7) If there is only one entry in a class, prize money will be paid as awarded by judge. If judged as 1st Place, payout will be paid accordingly.
- 8) Age of horses shall date from January 1st of the year in which they are foaled.
- 9) All animals entered in registered classes must be recorded in the record or stud book specified. Registration papers must be attached to the entry form. No exceptions. Current year animals do not require registration certificates but proof of eligibility must be attached to the entry form. No exceptions.
- 10) Horses must be named: "entry" is not acceptable.
- 11) No horse competing in any class admitted to the show ring shall leave such ring until all prizes for the class shown are awarded.
- 12) Proper attire required for all classes.
- 13) Any horse not sufficiently under control shall be asked to leave the ring.

STOPS:

On stops of 3 feet, 2 feet and 1 foot, a penalty point will be assessed for each inch under or over on each stop; teamster will be scored to the closest inch. Only one pull allowed for each stop and movement of logs constitutes a pull.

SCOREKEEPING:

Total points will be announced after each team has gone through the course. The team with the highest number of points wins. In the case of a tie, the judge will make the decision. **THE JUDGE'S DECISION IS FINAL.**

PULL REGULATIONS

- 1) Pull must be held in a secure area where general public is protected.
- 2) Only entered competitors, hookers, headers and officials allowed in pulling area.
- 3) Boundary lines 16 ft. apart. Length of pull 14 ft.
- 4) Off set double trees and neck yokes are allowed.
- 5) Each teamster is allowed two helpers. If helpers coach or interfere in any way, team will be disqualified. Header must leave the pulling boundary lines; teamster and hooker must remain behind hindquarters of horse.
- 6) Either teamster or hooker **may ride front** of the boat. There shall be **no riding** in the boat.
- 7) Once the team has been hooked to the boat, they must stay between the boundary lines.
- 8) Team allowed two tries to move the boat 14 feet. An unsuccessful attempt by the teamster to start the team constitutes one try. A boat moved six inches forward constitutes a pull.
- 9) Line rule waived for the first 3 pulls.
- 10) The pin and chain laid out flat measures 14 feet. Pin must be out completely to qualify as a pull.
- 11) Deliberate stalling will result in disqualification. Judge to warn teamsters once.
- 12) Deliberate jerking of load is prohibited. Team will be disqualified and will revert to previous weight pulled. Judge will warn teamsters once.
- 13) Whipping, slapping of lines at any time will result in disqualification and will revert to previous weight pulled.
- 14) There must be two linesmen and a pin man to assist the judge. The linesmen have the authority to tell the judge of any infractions and the judge must act upon their information.
- 15) A teamster may ask the judge to center the boat before hooking. If there are no means available to center boat, the judge may waive the line rule and ask the teamster to center the boat during the pull.
- 16) If a break in harness or equipment occurs there will be a time limit of five minutes to fix the break and complete the pull. If a teamster forfeits the pull or a five-minute time limit expires on the pull at which the breakage occurred he must pull the next weight the full distance or the weight recorded goes back to the previous completed pull.

- 17) Teamsters are not to argue with or harass the judge. To do so will result in instant disqualification and forfeiture of all prizes. Any complaint should be made to the pull committee.
- 18) All teams will be weighed on the same scale prior to the pull.
- 19) After a meeting of pull officials an unmanageable team may be disqualified.
- 20) Weight for each lift will be decided by pull committee.
- 21) Each team must pull each additional weight. No double lifting to be allowed except on the final pull the teamster can decide the weight.
- 22) Talking or shouting is permitted but not the use of profanity.
- 23) Three tries to hook the boat, otherwise disqualified and weight reverts to previous pull.
- 24) Pulling order heaviest to lightest unless it is not feasible.
- 25) Pulling direction should be changed if the horses can't complete the pull within the length of the lines.
- 26) One legal pull is required for hook-up money.
- 27) **JUDGE'S DECISION IS FINAL**

- 1) All classes are on an inter-club basis where applicable. Open to all 4-H members only.
- 2) Out of District 4-H projects must be entered by the 4-H Club Leader and must be received by the 4-H Fair Coordinator (Lois Taylor) no later than July 15th.
- 3) All BV 4-H projects will be reviewed by the 4-H Club Leader and the 4-H Fair Coordinator no later than the July Council meeting, based on club registrations.
- 4) 4-H members may enter their projects in open classes by paying the entry fee and completing the open class entry form, on their own.
- 5) All camping unit passes are requested by the 4-H Fair coordinator in club groups and fees are the responsibility of the individual member/family.
- 6) 4-H passes will be provided to leaders for distribution to participating 4-H members and leaders only. Parents and siblings must purchase appropriate passes at the Fair office prior to entry to the grounds. Wrist bands must be worn and lack of a wrist band will result in no grounds entry.
- 7) NO ANIMALS allowed in the camping areas, under any circumstances.

Housing:

- 8) Stabling for horse projects is the responsibility of individual members and clubs. Stable forms must be filled out.
- 9) 4-H projects will be allocated stalls, pens, cages or tables by the 4-H Coordinator.
- 10) No changes can be made to stalls, pens or cages until such changes are first cleared by the 4-H Fair Coordinator.

11) Cloverbud projects will be collected by club leaders and set up by the club designated leader on Tuesday, August 22, by 4 pm (Should be coordinated with the 4-H coordinator).

12) All livestock (with the exception of Poultry and Rabbits) are to be in the barns no earlier than 9 am and no later than 12 Noon for Beef; 1-3pm for Sheep, 9-11am for Swine on Thursday, August 24. (As per weighing times).

13) All barns, stalls, pens and cages must be cleaned before leaving the Fair grounds.

Livestock (beef, sheep, swine):

14) All beef, market lambs and swine are to be weighed "off the truck" before feeding, watering and washing.

15) No horns are permitted on any 4-H livestock. All market animals must be castrated. All animals must be free from communicable diseases.

16) Sheep must be inspected by the Division Director before unloading and weighing. Sheep must be free from keds, or will be refused entry into the 4H show and the Fair Grounds and summarily sent home. Market lambs are to be shorn to 1/2".

17) All beef animals are to be tied with appropriate halters and neckties.

18) Animals considered to be not marketable and which are culled may not be sold through the 4-H Auction; however, after the auction, signs may be posted offering the animal for sale.

19) In showmanship classes, the animal shown must be the 4-H member's project.

20) No 4-H animals are permitted in the camping areas at any time (including the days prior to the Thursday fair opening).

21) All exhibitors are encouraged to decorate their stalls, including information about the projects and the exhibitor. Education of the public is very important and through the promotion of projects, exhibitors contribute to the Fair's goals and objectives.

22) Projects may not leave the Fair grounds until after 5 pm Sunday without express permission from the 4-H Fair Coordinator.

Exhibitors' Guidelines: Variety name should be stated on exhibitors tag. This adds to the educational value of the fair. All vegetables and fruits should be free from pests, blemishes and mechanical injuries. Entries should be clean but not scrubbed to the point of damaging the surface.
Potatoes and Onions: Should not be washed at all. Arrange on paper or plastic plate.

Beets: Trim tops to 1/2 inch, leave roots intact; free of scab, scaling and sunburn.

Cabbages: The stalk should be trimmed but one or two of the outer leaves left on. A round, firm head is preferred.

Carrots: Tops should be trimmed to about 1/2 inch, fine bottom root may be trimmed but not cut off completely, no side roots. The surface should be smooth.

Kohlrabi: Roots and leaf stems should be trimmed close to the bulb.

Herbs: Even colouring, the herbs should be tied in neat bunches with clearly printed labels firmly attached.

Lettuce: All types of lettuce should be clean, tender, of even colour. Roots and only damaged outside leaves should be removed.

Onions: Roots trimmed to 1/2 inch, and tops should be mature, dried and trimmed to 1/2 inch. Only the dirty outer scales should be removed. Do not wash. Round shape is preferred.

Potatoes: No greening or scabs, eyes few and shallow, skin set, indicative of maturity, solid even coloured flesh, no inside growth cracks. Do not wash.

Rhubarb: All stalks at least 10 inches long, firm, and crisp. Pull stalks, cutting away loose, flaky tissue only. Trim leaf to 1 inch fan shape.

Squash: Trim stem to 1/2 inch, colour and shape appropriate to type, mature but not oversized.

Tomatoes: Should be firm, thick fleshed, no green shoulders on red tomatoes.

TERMINOLOGY:

Biennials: a plant that is grown the first year and blooms, seeds and dies the second year and is reproduced from seeds

Bloom: a single flower on a stem, foliage removed

Bouquet: cut flowers in a clear container

Collection: a group of cut flowers (not judged on arrangement)

Composition: the art of using the principles of design, utilizing plant material with suitable accessories, to be displayed in one container

Double & Semi-doubles: flower has more than one layer of petals

Kind: shall be used to indicate plant characteristics which are similar and that belong to the same general category; e.g., asters and petunias are kinds of flowers

Perennials: a plant that lives for more than two years, growing from the same root, bulb or tuber each year, wintering either in or out of the ground

Side shoots: a lateral branch, with subsequent branching, but with the main stem excluded

Single: flower has a centre with one layer of petals

Spike: a flower structure with flowers stemless on a common lengthened stalk. Used sometimes where stems of the individual flowers are very short; e.g., gladiolus, snapdragons

Spray: a branch, bearing dependent branchlets or flowers

Variety: plants within the kind that differ from one another in one or more special characteristics

JUDGING STANDARDS:

Form: Uniformity, proper shape and proper petalage

Stem & Foliage: Strength and or straightness, quality, size and proportion

Colour: Uniformity, intensity, clarity and brilliance

Size: Uniformity and proper size for variety

Condition: Must be free of blemish, pests, disease and damage

RULES:

- Please attach entry tags onto containers with ribbon, yarn or an elastic band before bringing to the Exhibit Hall – no tape accepted.

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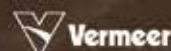

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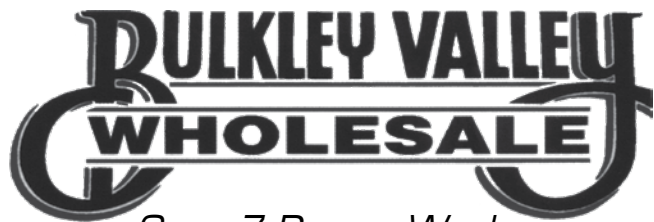
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2023 BVX LIGHT HORSE SHOW AUGUST 24TH-27TH

People want to see what horses are still being used for in the 21st century, so, as the Light Horse Show committee, we attempt to provide classes for you, the exhibitor, to show your horses in the best light possible. We also hope to educate the public about light horses as you showcase your animals, and your skills. With that in mind we want to thank you, the exhibitor, our ground crew, volunteers and sponsors for supporting this endeavor and hope your experience at the 2023 Bulkley Valley Exhibition Light Horse show will be one to remember. What's New in 2023!

We have made changes to the payout adding more money to the prize money account. Classes with 2 entries or less (Last year was 3 or less and only 1st place received \$15) now receive \$25 for 1st place and \$15 for 2nd. We upped the 3rd place winnings to \$15 so you win your entry fee back.

New Highpoint and added classes for the **Western Walk/Trot Division** with classes in Trail, Reining, Pleasure and a class in Halter or Showmanship for qualifying in HighPoint.

Dressage Light Horse Entries Close: August 6th, 2023 NEW!

All Light Horse Entries Close: August 12th, 2023

- 1) **EARLY BIRD ENTRY DRAW close: July 31st, 2023.** Correct entry and full payment is required. One horse/rider combination will be drawn. The prize is the refunded class entry fee for ONE horse/rider combination up to a maximum of \$100.
- 2) This show will be governed by official HCBC rules except where otherwise stated. Each exhibitor is responsible for knowing the rules applicable for their classes. For more information visit www.hcbc.ca/Competition-Documents.html
- 3) NO riding on the grounds with a horse in halter only, doubling on a horse, and/or trotting/jogging, canter/loping outside the warm up and show rings. The rider will be disqualified from the show for non-compliance.
- 4) As per HCBC rules, all juniors, whether English, Breed, Western or Driving, must wear an approved equestrian safety helmet while riding/driving on the show grounds. This includes children being transported on horseback

or buggy. The person responsible will be disqualified from the show for non-compliance. It is highly recommended that all adults wear a helmet as well.

5) REFUNDS:

- a) Only CLASS Entry fees will be refunded. Administration fees are non-refundable.
- b) No refunds will be made unless a certificate from a farrier, veterinarian, certified therapist or doctor is supplied to the show manager or designate before the completion of the show.
- c) Refunds will be mailed out within 45 days after the show. The final date for queries regarding refunds and payouts is 30 days after the mailing of the cheques.

6) ENTRY FORM

- a) We require ONE ENTRY per HORSE/EXHIBITOR combination (the forms are available online at www.bvfair.ca or at Fair Office & Smithers Feed Store).
- b) If entering a registered breed class, the owner must include a copy of the horse's registration papers.
- c) Horse Council B.C. Membership is mandatory for all classes. www.hcbc.ca
- d) Entries are not considered valid unless the appropriate funds are paid in full.
- e) Halter, Driving, Performance Classes, Gymkhana - \$15/class
- f) Best Yearling - \$25/class
- g) Dressage - \$15/class
- h) Dressage au concours - \$15/class (space permitting)
- i) Jumpers & Hunters - \$15/class
- j) Stake Classes - \$25/class
- k) Ride-a-Buck - \$5 paid at gate, no money submitted with entry form.
- l) Each horse and rider combination pays entry fee in pairs/team classes.
- m) Hunter/Jumper Crew Setup fees. A \$10 setup crew fee per horse/rider must be included with the entry fees. If you enter both Hunter & Jumper, you must pay 2 fees per entry.
- n) Post Entry fees for a New Exhibitor: \$50 Admin fee plus \$5 per class Post entry fee. For an existing exhibitor who entered prior to deadline of August 12th a \$5 post entry charge added to regular class fee.
- o) All class/horse changes and post entries must be made at the LHS office window. Whipper-in gate entries/changes will NOT be accepted into any ring.
- p) All monies owing to the LHS must be cleared before prize money is paid out, regardless of the 30 day rule for payouts.

7) EXHIBITOR'S PACKAGES (horse/exhibitor numbers, passes, etc)

- a) Your pre-paid passes will be ready for pickup when you arrive at Gate #1- Light Horse Show entrance-exit. (Please refer to the site map in the BV Fair prize book) starting Wednesday afternoon at 3 pm. No early arrivals will be permitted.
- b) **Please be aware that entry to the grounds will be denied unless you have the appropriate passes. If there is a problem at the gate, purchase a gate pass, come to the Light Horse office and let us help you sort it out.**
- c) All horse/exhibitor numbers which are incomplete will be held at the LHS office. They will only be handed out after ALL

security deposits, stabling deposits, entry fees and/or documentation are paid/submitted in full.

8) STABLING:

- a) Payment for all applicable stabling fees MUST BE received before the horse will be allowed in the barn or panel pen. Cleaning deposit (\$50) must be a separate cheque.
- b) Properly made out entries, complete with all applicable fees will receive priority over incomplete ones in allotting stalls.
- c) We require a cleaning deposit, \$50 per stall or panel space. PLEASE PROVIDE A SEPARATE CHEQUE FOR THIS FEE. ALL STALLS AND PANEL SPACES MUST BE STRIPPED OR THE DEPOSIT WILL BE CASHED.
- d) Complaints about dirty stalls or panels may be lodged with the Barn Manager who will charge the cleaning deposit if the complaint is upheld. IN ORDER TO GET YOUR DEPOSIT REFUNDED YOU MUST SHOW THE STRIPPED STALL TO THE BARN MANAGER.
- e) Only 3 horses allowed per panel pen. **Competitors provide their own panels. BV Exhibition does not supply panels.**
- f) **If you take a stall you weren't assigned or do not vacate your stall on time, a \$50 penalty will be charged against your payouts.**
- g) All stalls and alley ways must be KEPT CLEAN

9) STALL DECORATING CONTEST:

Those who participate will be judged for a chance to win one of 2 prizes of \$50 per day. That's a total of \$400 in prizes for stall decorations all weekend.

Rules for decorating contest

- a) Full coverage of available space (min. 75%)
- b) Use 2023 Fall Fair Theme
- c) Educational display (size 22"x28") of horse related subject. The following is NOT considered educational content: breeder, sale advertisement, business information, and or show records. These may be displayed in addition to the educational content.
- d) Stalls will be judged by Show Committee and prize added to payout at end of show.

10) PANELS:

- a) **Panel space is limited and will be awarded on a first-come/first-serve basis.** Panel space passes must be clearly visible on the panels.
- b) Panel pens will be only allowed around the perimeter of the camping area. This will allow the users of those pens to camp close to their horses. We organize camping/panel space accordingly, in marked & numbered sites.
- c) A minimum 3 ft gap between panel pens is needed for horse safety reasons. Horse trailers may be located between pens so riders may saddle up without taking horses into the camping area.

11) AGE SPECIFICATIONS:

- a) **Junior Horse:** 5 years & under, Horse age is calculated as of January 1st the year the horse was born. In Western classes, may be shown one or two-handed with a snaffle or bosal, or one-handed in a leverage bit.
- b) **First Year Horse:** A horse that (regardless of age) is in its first year under saddle in such a class as of January 1st of the current year
- c) **First Year Rider:** A rider who (regardless of age) is in the first year competing under saddle.
- d) **Senior Rider:** 18 & over as of January 1st of the current year.

- e) **Junior:** 17 AND UNDER as of January 1st of the current year
- f) **Youth Rider:** 7 to 17 as of January 1st of the current year
- g) **Tiny Tot:** 6 & under as of January 1st of the current year.
- h) **Amateur/Non-Pro:** 19 years and over as of January 1st of the current year.
- i) **Walk / Trot Jog Classes:** A rider who (regardless of age) is competing in walk / trot classes (no cross entries)

12) PRIZES:

- a) Payouts except where noted: 1st \$50, 2nd \$25, 3rd \$10, 4th – 6th place, ribbons
- b) Classes with 3 or fewer entrants: 1st \$25, 2nd \$15, 3rd ribbon
- c) Stake classes payouts: (1st 50%, 2nd 30%, 3rd 20%) Minimum of three entries in stake classes to be held.
- d) \$50 Added Money in all Stake Classes.
- e) Equitation, Reinsmanship, Horsemanship and Showmanship do not receive prize money.
- f) BVX Best of Show: 1st place only - \$200,
- g) BVX Best Yearling: Paid out as stake. First place has \$100 added to winnings.
- h) Classes with fewer than 4 entries may be combined or cancelled (with refund to competitor) at the discretion of the show management.
- i) In case of a tie, the prize money will be combined and split equally.
- j) ALL PRIZES AND PAYOUT CHEQUES WILL BE GIVEN/WRITTEN TO THE PERSON DESIGNATED ON THE ENTRY FORM as Owner or Exhibitor.
- k) Payouts and Stake Class winnings will be mailed within 30 days after the end of the show. The final date for queries regarding refunds and payouts is 30 days after the mailing of the cheques.

13) HOLDING RING:

- a) It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to bring his/her horse to the holding ring when called. **NO GATE HOLDS.**
- b) **No refunds** will be made for late arrivals to class.

14) CAR/CAMPING FEES & REGULATIONS:

- a) **All vehicles** coming onto the grounds must have a car pass in order to park on the grounds. If you are camping, you will also need 1 camping pass per camp space. There will be no more than 2 car passes per entry.
- b) **Space will be provided** to exhibitors for day parking.
- c) Camping passes are assigned on a first-come/first-served basis. Please consider that space is limited. Exhibitor camping passes are \$30 for the weekend per camping space and are for campers or trailers that stay on the grounds overnight. This camping fee does NOT include fees for panels or the car pass.
- d) Camping spaces or slots will be assigned by the LHS Camp Ground Manager. Let us know your preferred camping spot and/or the names of people you wish to be located nearby. We will try to accommodate your wishes; however, this will be determined on a first-come/first-served basis. You will receive a slot number and may only set up your camper at the assigned slot.

- e) **Parking in camping slots not assigned to you will cause removal of your vehicle or trailer at your expense.**

- f) The Show Committee reserves the right to charge for additional spaces if you require more space than the average truck and trailer or camper.

15) VEHICLE ACCESS TO THE GROUNDS:

- a) Vehicles may not arrive, park or camp before 3 pm on Wednesday. Any vehicle from previous show must be prepared to be reallocated to a BVX spot.
- b) **All vehicles camping on the grounds must have their camping pass clearly displayed or the vehicle will be removed at the owner's expense.**
- c) All vehicles/individuals leaving/returning to the campground must clearly display their car pass/wristband or entry to the grounds will be denied.
- d) **All LHS vehicle traffic must enter and leave via Gate #1.** Competitors who do not choose to co-operate with this rule, made for the safety and comfort of the public at the show, will be excused from the show.

DEFINITION OF CLASSES specific to BVX

- 16) **BVX BEST YEARLING:** open to registered yearlings of any breed.

- 17) **BVX BEST OF SHOW:** Champion and reserve of the BVX Overall Championship Class per Breed Division qualify for BVX Best of Show class.

18) WALK-JOG/TROT CLASSES:

- NO cross-entries.

19) BVX GYMKHANA:

The gymkhana is run under Northern Saddle Club rules. www.northernsaddleclub.com and HCBC.

20) BVX Trail In Hand:

- a) In Hand is open to 2 yr olds & under.
- b) No cross entry allowed with Trail classes entered under saddle.
- c) Walk-jog/trot only.
- d) No whips allowed; hands may only touch the horse for side pass.

21) HUNTER/JUMPER

- a) **New! Jumper classes held on Saturday and Hunter Classes held on Sunday.**
- b) **This Show is a BC Interior Hunter Jumper Association qualifier. Classes 1500 to 1511 and 1600-1613 are qualifiers.**
- c) Competitors may enter up to 4 classes in 2 divisions, at 2 consecutive heights in Jumper and/or Hunter plus specialty classes. Hunter and Jumper heights must be the same. One au concour class is allowed either 1 height lower as a warmup or 1 class higher. Au concour class must be specified on entry form.
- d) CSA approved helmets must be worn and fastened in both the warm up and competition rings.
- e) Post entries will ride first in all classes.
- f) Team of Two class entrants must have been in 2 other open classes to qualify. No Entry Fee, No Prize Money.
- g) Lexy's plate, jump off is awarded to fastest clear round. If no clear round, plate is not awarded.

22) BVX REINING CLASSES

- a) National Reining Horse Association (NRHA) rules will be followed unless specified otherwise. <http://nrha1.com>

- b) Beginner reining classes may be ridden 2-handed or 1-handed, in any legal headgear, **regardless of horse's age.**
- c) BVX Beginner reining Junior Horse is a horse/rider combination that has not competed in a one-handed (non-modified) pattern prior to January 1st of the current show year, regardless of horse's age.
- d) Beginner Freestyle: open to any beginner rider, 2-handed optional. Minimum requirements: 3 consecutive spins in each direction, 1 large & 1 small circle in each direction, 2 rollbacks in each direction, 1 stop & backup. Exhibitors must supply (2 hrs prior to class) one recorded song timed for 3 minutes per CD, with exhibitor name, number and class number clearly marked on CD.
- e) Never Won A Buckle (if offered): open to any non-pro rider who has never won a buckle prior to the show. 2-handed optional. Should all riders be disqualified a re-ride will be offered to all riders entered in the class.
- f) Open Reining: open to any horse/rider combination.
- g) Open Freestyle: open to any horse/rider combination, May be ridden 2 handed, 1 handed or no hands. Minimum of 4 consecutive spins each direction, 3 stops, 2 lead changes; one right to left & the other left to right. Exhibitor has to provide recorded music on CD with one song only, Time limit 4 minutes. Exhibitor name and number must be clearly marked on CD.

23) RANCH RIDING CLASSES

- a) Ranch Riding should reflect the versatility attitude and movement of a working horse. For the Open Classes the AQHA rules. Patterns will be posted. **No cross entries.**

24) BVX BRIDLE-LESS TRAIL/BRIDLE PATH

- a) Horses may be shown under Western or English tack.
- b) Horses will not be asked to perform on the rail, but the course will be designed to require the horse to walk-jog/trot. There is NO lope/canter.
- c) Must be ridden with NO bridle/halter. A neck strap, rein or rope may be used.

25) SPECIALTY RIDING CLASSES

- a) **Tiny Tot:** Riders need to be 6 & under as of January 1 of the current year. Handler must be 14 years or older. Tiny Tot must have a CSA certified riding helmet, bridle & reins. And HCBC membership. Handler controls horse via halter & lead rope. There is no entry fee for this class.
- b) **Novelty Costume:** Horse & rider to be shown in any type of costume, either to be ridden or in hand, at a walk only. If an entry is being led, the handler must be 14 years or older. To be judged on costume creativity of both horse & rider as well as horse's acceptance of the costume. CSA approved helmet must be worn by junior riders. There is no entry fee charge for this class. Admin fee applies. Prizes only.
- c) **Ride-A-Buck:**
 - i) A \$5 bill is required to enter this class by paying the Ring Steward directly. Riders will then receive a piece of paper at the in-gate to place between the horse and the rider's leg just above the knee.

- ii) The horse is to be ridden bareback.
- iii) The exhibitor has to perform as requested by judge in all 3 gaits.
- iv) Last rider to retain his/her 'buck' wins the class. Prize money to be collected from the Ring Steward. No ribbons.
- d) **Pairs:** Matched Pairs. Pairs will walk, trot/jog, canter/lope as in pleasure classes, but will be judged on how well matched they are in colour, gait, size and conformation.
- e) **2-way Combination:** Two people, one horse. One person is the designated rider, the other the groom. The team of rider, groom and horse start out Western and end up English. The class will run, walk, jog, lope both ways of the ring then everyone lines up, grooms come in with gear to help change over to English. Everyone rides, walk, trot, canter both ways of the ring and then line up. Judge may break any ties by asking for other maneuvers.
- f) **First Year Rider Keyhole:** A rider who (regardless of age) is in the first year competing under saddle.
- g) **First Year Rider Barrels:** A rider who (regardless of age) is in the first year competing under saddle.

26) DRIVING

- a) General Rules
 - i) Horses must not be left unattended nor bridle removed while the horse is harnessed to the vehicle. Drivers who fail to comply with these rules will be eliminated from the show. Drivers under 15 years must be accompanied by an adult.
 - ii) An appropriate whip must be carried in all classes.
 - iii) All drivers must be appropriately attired, including a hat, gloves & an apron or rug.
 - iv) Grooms: optional for single horse turnout, one required per team & 2 required for unicorn or 4-hitch.
 - v) Grooms to be suitably attired, including hat.
- b) Driving Classes: see HCBC for rules.

27) BVX WILD TRAIL CHALLENGE

The objective is to take your horse through a series of obstacles laid out in a course to demonstrate the partnership between horse and rider by completing each obstacle willingly and swiftly. Horse and Rider teams are judged not only on how quickly they finish the course, but also on the level of horsemanship. More points are awarded for demonstrating a partnership with the horse and completing the task with ease. Rider has the option of Western or English tack. Helmets must be worn by Junior riders, boots with a heel are mandatory for all entrants. Riders have 30 seconds per obstacle. Juniors (class 1901) must complete 10 obstacles; Seniors (class 1902) must complete 12. Obstacles may be completed in riders' desired order. The BVX Buckin Crazy's Wild Trail Class (1900) is open to horse/ rider combination who have not competed in this type of Challenge before. Rules will be available online at www.bvfair.ca

28) BVX SG QUALIFIER CLASSES AND DRESSAGE CLASSES

- a) All tests are EC (EXCEPT Walk Trot and Western Dressage tests are HCBC).
- b) All Dressage class times and order will be posted Wednesday evening at the **Dressage Ring**. It is your responsibility to check for

your times and order of go. Due to time restrictions, entries will be limited to 60 rides total on Thursday, and 30 rides total on Friday. Times are allotted as entries are received on a first come, first served basis. All tests are ridden in a 20 x 60 meter ring.

- c) Riders may ride 2 tests at one level or at consecutive levels, plus Freestyle for a total of 3 classes.
- d) TOC (Test of Choice) needs to be specified on entry form
